### **SIDE SHOW, COMMERCIAL AND PAVILION REGULATIONS**

1. All show exhibitors must have proper Public Risk Insurance cover for \$20,000,000.
2. FREE PASSES - One Free Pass for each \$50 of rental paid will be issued upon payment for site. Non-transferable – clearly stamped on admission ticket. There will be no exceptions to this rule. Maximum of 4 passes per site.
3. All food prices must be clearly displayed.
4. NO RIDING OF MINI-MOTOR BIKES IN SHOWGROUND.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. The member's annual fees of \$25 single or \$35 family is to be paid by 24th of August which covers the following privileges: Free entrance to showground for themselves, a vehicle, one guest and members of the family to High School age.
  - 1a. Junior members Under 18 years, annual membership half rate. Privileges same as for full members, except Junior Members will receive one ticket.
  - 1b. Single members \$25 to be paid by 31st August, covers 1 adult and 3 school aged children.
2. Entrance fees are as per schedule.
3. An entry ticket must accompany each exhibit, obtainable from the secretary, at time of making entry, and no exhibitor will be allowed to show without such ticket, which must be attached to the exhibit or handed to the steward in charge of the class to which it belongs.
4. Exhibitors are not allowed to compete for more than one prize (either Association or special) with the same exhibit in Classes for Cattle, Sheep, Pigs or Poultry, unless otherwise expressed in the prize list.
5. Stallions can be shown in stallion classes only, unless stated otherwise, and must be kept under control at all times.
6. All exhibits in Classes AG, AG1, DP, C, C1, PR, FVK, K1, L, M, Ma, M1, N, N1 are to be produced by exhibitor.
7. All horse's ages date from August 1.
  - 8a. No exhibit from either the Industrial or Commercial Pavilions shall be removed from the Pavilion until 4.30pm on the second day of the Show.  
Chief or sectional stewards must be in attendance when exhibits are being taken to check exhibits are being taken by the bona fide owner.
  - 8b. Any person infringing these rules will be liable for disqualification from exhibiting at any future show and if the exhibitor has been awarded a prize such prize shall be liable for forfeiture.
- Perishable goods may be sold after 5pm on the second day of the show.
9. Any exhibitor interfering in any way with the judge or calling into question their awards, may be removed from the Showground and in the future may be disqualified from exhibiting at the Association's Shows.
10. The Committee has the power to investigate and deal with all cases of fraudulent entry, suspicious running, or misbehaviour of any kind whatever in connection with the special attractions and may review and deal with any case under disqualification which may appear to them to have any bearing upon the events decided or to be decided.
11. Exhibitors shall, if required, furnish Statutory Declarations as to the bona fides of their exhibits, and any exhibitor proved to have knowingly made a false entry for any prize or they have willfully infringed any of the Rules, Regulations etc, shall be subject to all or any of the following penalties: forfeiture of all entrance fees and prizes, non-permission to exhibit again, or expulsion from the Association.

12. The Committee reserves the right to call upon any Competitor subject to age limit, at any time to furnish, at his or her expense, birth certificate or other proof of age, and may at its discretion, withhold any prizemoney until such certificate or proof have been furnished. The age of the Competitor shall be taken as on the day of appearance in the Show.
13. Any person objecting to any award or to an exhibit must enter a protest in writing fully setting out the grounds of such objection, and lodge it with the Secretary before 4pm on the day event judged. Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$2 which shall be forfeited if the Committee finds the protest frivolous. The decision of the Committee shall be final.
14. 'No exhibitor shall be allowed to attach to any of the exhibits any prize ticket or ribbons other than those awarded at the current Show, except during the Parade and in the Cattle Pavilion on Friday morning of the Show'.
15. Every care shall be taken of the exhibits intended for exhibition, but the Association shall not be responsible for any loss caused by death or otherwise.
16. Prizes will be paid over up to a period of 2 weeks after the last day of the Show, at the Secretary's Office which will be open 9.30am to 3.30pm, and any exhibitor not claiming a prize within that time shall not have any claim against the Association.
17. Everything offered by auction and sold on the ground shall be subject to a charge of one and a half per cent (1.5 cents in the value realised, the selling auctioneer shall be responsible to the Secretary for the amount).
18. All exhibitors/competitors who are not members of the Association will be charged entrance to the ground on both main days of the show.  
Exhibitors of all classes are advised that under no circumstances will they be allowed to enter the ground free to deliver their exhibits. Exhibitors wishing to collect exhibits will not be allowed free entry into the showground until after 4.30pm on the second day of the show.
19. No gambling or games of chance will be permitted on the Association's ground.
20. The Association will not be responsible for failure to carry out any event advertised in the schedule.
21. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, The Association reserves the right to refuse admittance to, or remove same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
22. No property of Women's Auxiliary is to be loaned or rented to anyone.
23. The Association reserves the right to check all bags, prams etc to check that alcohol is not being brought in to the grounds. Should any alcohol to found, it will be confiscated.

*Ag Shows NSW competition*

## INGREDIENTS

250g sultanas  
250 g chopped raisins  
250 g currants  
125 g chopped mixed peel  
90 g chopped red glace cherries  
90 g chopped blanched almonds  
1/3 cup sherry or brandy  
250 g plain flour  
60 g self-raising flour  
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger  
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves  
250g butter  
250g soft brown sugar  
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR  
finely grated lemon rind  
1/2 teaspoon almond essence  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence  
4 large eggs.

## RECOMMENDED METHOD

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Judge Note: The cake should not exceed the height of 5.7cm

**HEALTH REGULATIONS-** Any animal infected by ringworm or warts will be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show. Cattle from any State or Territory of the Commonwealth of Australia are eligible for entry provided they are not subject to quarantine or restriction with respect to Tuberculosis, Johne's Disease or any other notifiable disease.

**JOHNE'S DISEASE-** Except where the Society at its absolute discretion may determine otherwise, no cattle may be exhibited unless from a herd, stud or property for which a Johne's Disease Health Declaration has been submitted to the Cattle Section by the closing date of entries. The Exhibitor must sign a Johne's disease Health Declaration in such form as the Society may require.

**PESTI VIRUS-** Only tested and cleared animals will be accepted on the grounds. Non-tested animals WILL NOT BE PERMITTED ON THE GROUNDS. Note that all exhibits including calves must have clearance! Please ensure that your animals are tested in consultation with your vet and testing certificates are provided prior to the Show. If your animal is not tested and documentation cannot be provided, the entry will not be accepted.

**SECURITY OF ANIMALS-** All bull exhibits over the age of 8 months, shall be ringed through the nose and at all times be led by such ring. If the Stewards or the Society's officials determine that any bull is unsafe, such bull shall be placed under such control as directed by the Stewards or the Society's officials. All females must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead. In the Beef Section all females must be fitted with a nose grip when being led. All Led Steers must be fitted with either a ring or nose grip when being paraded. Each Exhibitor shall ensure that each of their exhibits is securely tethered in its stall. Please note - modifications of, or additions to tie up facilities is strictly prohibited. The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each adult competitor must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying the Forbes PA&H Assoc Inc and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor for his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18 years of age. ALSO, on each Waiver, each horse with which the competitor is involved in competition at the Show must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the show.

- Stallions ineligible to compete in classes other than stallion classes.
- Wrist bands will be issued and must be worn by all competitors.
- All breed classes are for Registered Horses only - papers must be produced on request and exhibitors must be financial members
- Judging will commence strictly to the program. The Committee reserves the rights to alter this program at their own discretion.
- Drug testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor found to have breached AgShows NSW will be disqualified, and further action will be taken.
- Disputes and Disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee.
- PIC numbers must be supplied. No PIC number, no start.
- Horses and ponies may compete in either Open or Hunter classes, not both.
- Novice is a horse/ pony which has not won an individual first prize in an equivalent class at another Agricultural or Breed Show.
